



## Welcome to Traffic2Net

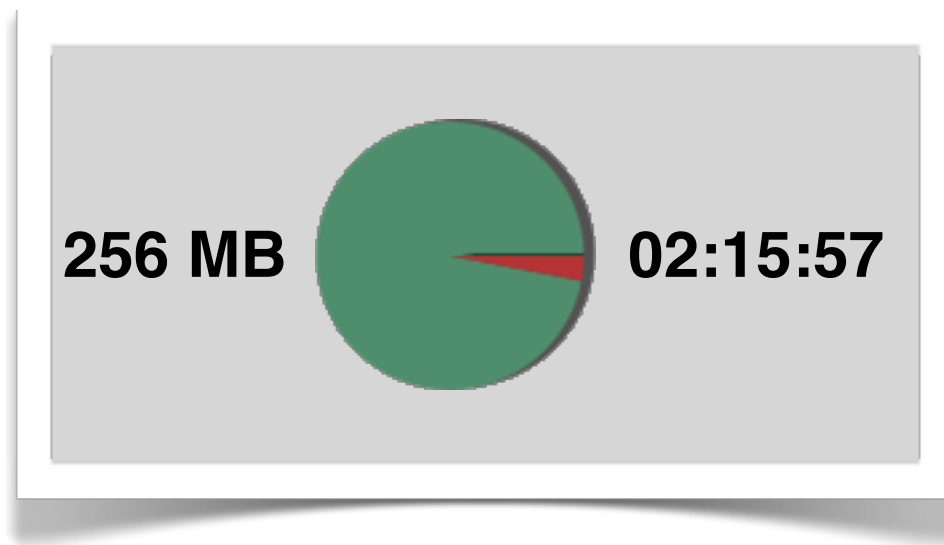
Traffic2Net is a modern tool to track the online time and data usage of mobile Internet connections. An easy to use but powerful statistics manager offers a detailed look of each connection.

The demo version of Traffic2Net allows you to use the software for 30 days.

## Menu bar icon

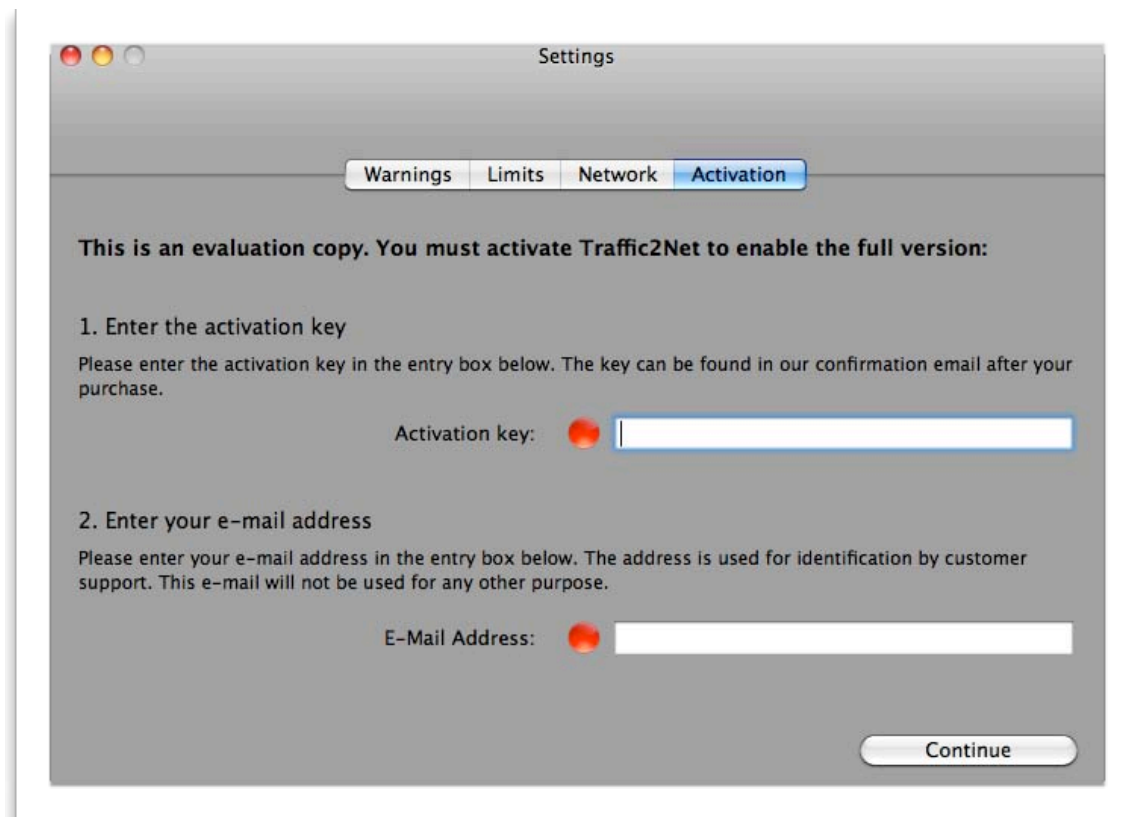
As soon as you have installed Traffic2Net, you will see a new icon in your menu bar. Whenever you use a mobile Internet connection, you will see the online time and the data usage of the current connection displayed next to the icon. Click on the menu bar icon to open the statistics and the settings windows of Traffic2Net.



The icon shows the download in green and the upload in red. So you can have a quick glance on the upload/download ratio.

## Activate Traffic2Net

To use the full version of Traffic2Net, you have to activate the software.



### How to activate Traffic2Net:

- Click menu bar icon > Settings... to open the Settings window.
- Click 'Activation' to open the activation window.
- Enter the activation key, e-mail address and click 'Continue'.
- Accept the license terms.

Traffic2Net is now activated.

## Deactivate your license of Traffic2Net

To save your investment in Traffic2Net, you can use your activation on another new Macintosh. To do so, you have to deactivate your license on the current Macintosh computer first:

- Open the Settings window of Traffic2Net:  
Click [menu bar icon](#) > [Settings](#) in the menu bar.
- Click [,Activation'](#) to open the activation window.
- Click [,Deactivate'](#) to release your license.
- Now you can use your activation key to activate Traffic2Net on another Macintosh computer.

## Statistics manager

The statistics manager allows you to see the details of every mobile connection, from the online time to the data volume, from the average download and upload speed to the IP address which has been used.

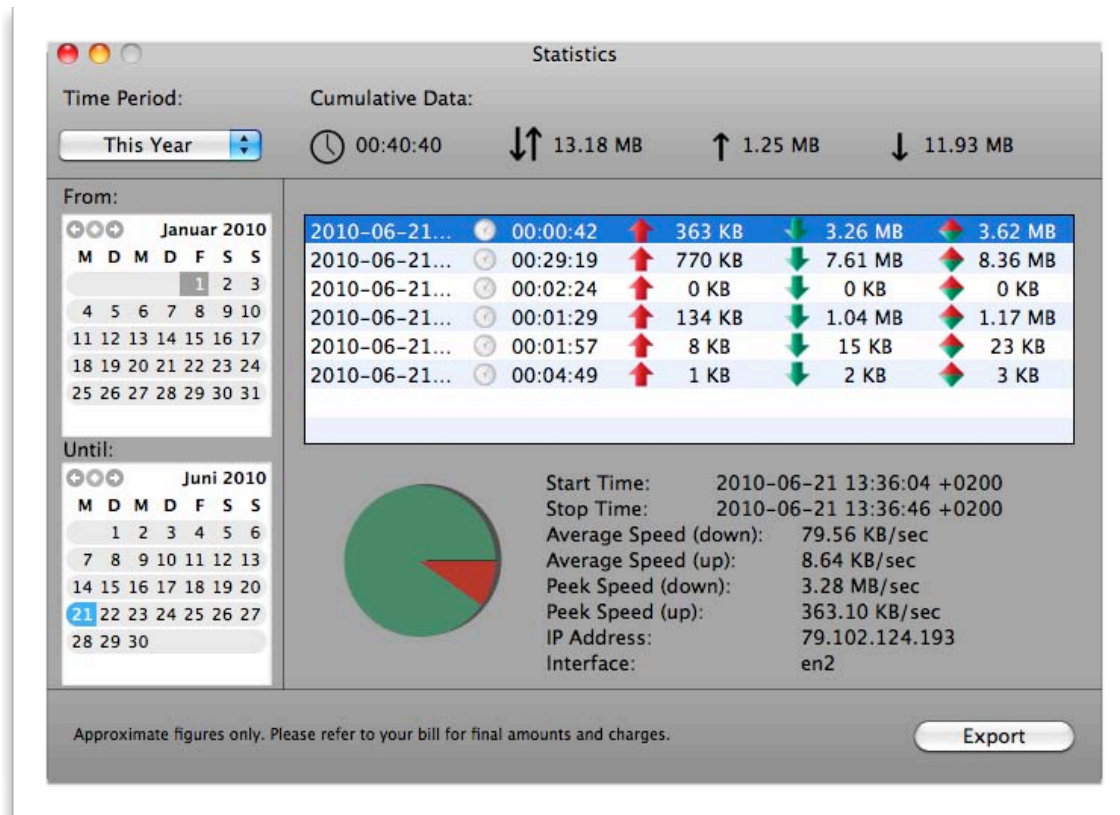

Use the left pane to select a time period. You can use a predefined period or use the calendar to select a custom one.

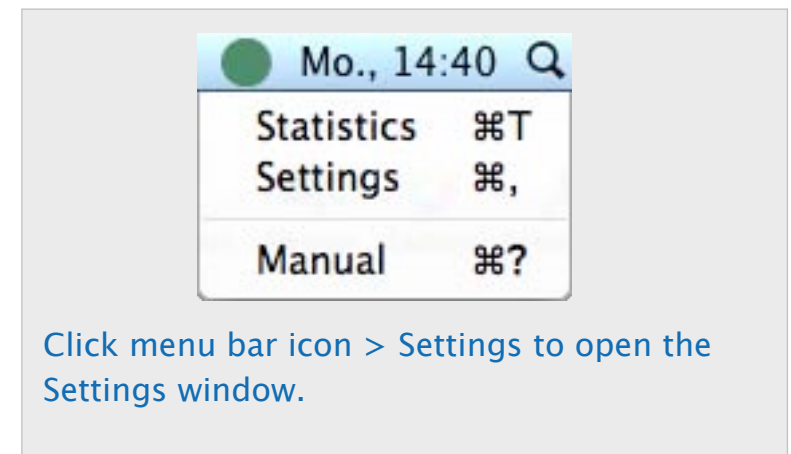
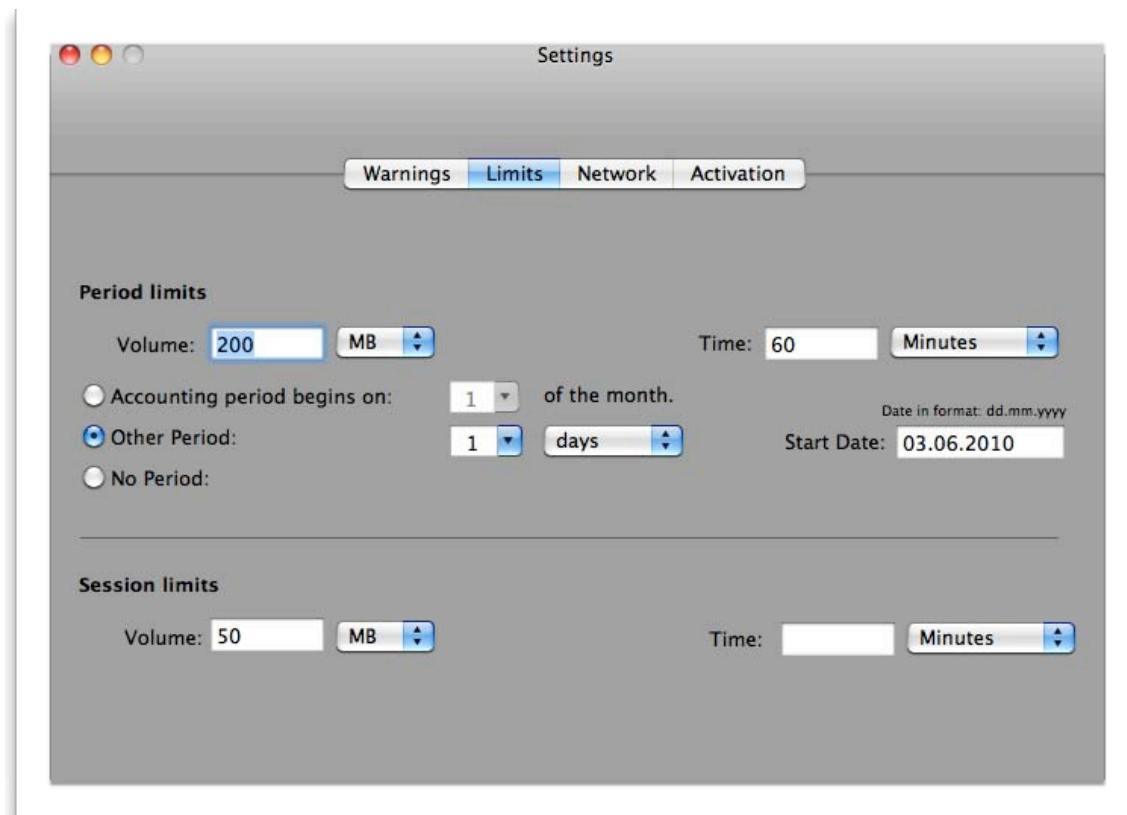
Next to the time selection, the cumulative data is shown: The total online time and the total data volume of the selected period.

The right pane displays all the mobile connections Traffic2Net has tracked during the selected period. Click on any connection to see its details.

## Settings

Whether you want to activate Traffic2Net, set limits for data or online time volume or need to manually select the network port, you can do so in the settings of Traffic2Net.





Warnings: Select if you would like to see a warning message on the screen, if the data volume exceeds a limit and/or if the online time exceeds a limit.



Limits: Allows you to set session and period limits for online time and data volume usage.

- Session limits: These limits apply to every connection.
- Period limits: These limits apply for the time period you define here.



**Network:** Select the modem port your 2G/3G device is using

Sometimes a mobile device installs several ports within Mac OS X. One port might be used for checking the signal strength, the next port might be used to send/receive text messages and the third port may be used for mobile Internet connections. If you feel Traffic2Net is tracking the wrong port, you can change the modem port Traffic2Net is monitoring here.

Usually, Traffic2Net will find and use the right modem port automatically.



**Activation:** Switch to a full version by entering an activation key. See chapter [Activation](#) for details on the activation process.

### Help

#### Uninstall Traffic2Net:

To uninstall Traffic2Net, open the disk image and doubleclick on ,Deinstall Traffic2Net'. If you do not have the disk image any more, you can download it here:
